

ASIC is a Hybrid Conference

Our UC Davis team is eager to see you in-person at the Pasadena Convention Center next May, however the health and safety of attendees and staff is very important to us. While some states and countries are allowed to meet in-person with safety precautions in place, we understand that this is not the case across the globe. Therefore, the 2022 conference will be hosted as a robust and hybrid event to accommodate those who are unable to attend in-person. There will be virtual meetings, networking, presentations, posters and a virtual exhibit hall that we will have additional information on this coming February.

For those that can join us in-person, we will continue to host the conference in a similar fashion to the 2018 event with podium presentations, lightning talks, an expansive exhibit hall, trainings and specialty meetings. To keep everyone healthy and safe, we are closely monitoring the COVID-19 pandemic and will follow CDC and UC Davis guidelines for safely hosting events.

Health & Safety at ASIC

As part of our effort to hold a safe and productive meeting, our Technical Program Committee and UC Davis team has determined that proof of COVID-19 vaccination will be required for all registrants attending the ASIC in Pasadena. Every in-person attendee, speakers, exhibitors, and all ASIC staff will be required to show proof that they are fully vaccinated with a vaccine approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration or the World Health Organization before receiving registration badge and materials.

Additionally, attendees are required to wear a mask over their nose and mouth while indoors at all times, except when actively eating or drinking. Presenters are required to wear a mask at the podium while giving a presentation or answering questions. Your safety and the safety of our staff is a priority and we thank you in advance for following these rules.

Finally, each day, in-person attendees will be asked to take a symptom survey to report any health concerns so that we can actively monitor the situation.
